

Assistant Professor of Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics and Computer Science at Salisbury University is accepting applications for the position of Assistant Professor of Mathematics. The Mathematics and Computer Science Department resides in a new building with state-of-the-art classrooms and laboratory facilities. The department offers degrees in mathematics and computer science, and numerous courses to satisfy requirements for degrees in other areas.

Area of Specialization: Mathematics Education

Primary Job Duties: Teaching, advising students, serving on committees, scholarship, working with other faculty in professional collaboration and teacher education projects. The normal teaching load is 12 hours (3-4 courses) per semester. Many of our majors are seeking secondary certification in teaching and the department offers a Master of Science in Mathematics Education so the mathematical development of teachers is also a department priority. Candidates must demonstrate an effective teaching style that supports a diverse student body.

Minimum Qualifications: A master's in mathematics (or equivalent) and a doctorate in mathematics education or statistics education; or a doctorate in mathematics with experience in mathematics education is required. Candidates must communicate effectively in spoken and written English.

Required Knowledge/Skills/Abilities: Candidates must demonstrate a commitment to excellence in teaching, scholarly development, service, and departmental leadership in mathematics education. Successful candidates will demonstrate a commitment to undergraduate education and a willingness to teach a broad range of introductory mathematics courses as well as possess an ability to contribute to mid and upper-level offerings for majors, specifically, for those in elementary, middle, and secondary mathematics education. Undergraduate research is a priority of the Department and the successful candidate should be able to demonstrate a commitment to its principles
